Our Bargara veteran golfers have so many interesting stories about life, travel and golf courses played all around the world.

Following is another fascinating and interesting tale as told by Bob and Kaye Nicholls.

For any die-hard golfers visiting Tasmania this experience is a bucket list must do.

Ratho Farm is near the quaint village of Bothwell located 181 km south of Devonport and 80 km from Hobart. This historical sporting venue is the oldest continuously used golf course in Australia and the oldest outside of Scotland. It was established in 1822 by the Reid family who emigrated from Scotland.

This golf course is a time capsule, among the best preserved of all the world's early golf courses. Its most apparent uniqueness is the sheep, which graze and keep the playing areas short and fences to keep them from the **square** greens. The first hole for men is a 164m Par 3. If you look carefully at the photo you can just see the tip of the flag.

Can you imagine hitting over sheds, fences and hedges.... you are guaranteed for a lot of laughs and certainly a unique experience.

The farm house is charming and you can share a communal two course dinner in the main dining room with other guests staying at the farm. They also have an extensive wine collection. The accommodation is rustic but modernised and very comfortable.



SPOTLIGHT

DELL BARRETT

Having just played in Life Members Day, I thought it fitting to spotlight Del in this edition by outlining her history with Bargara Golf Club and our Vets.

Dell joined the Bargara Golf Club in 1971 in the era of John Jones being the Pro and then later that year Norman Hobbs taking over who I am guessing some of you may remember. Her handicap back then was 36 and it took her 15 months



to break it. On 11 June 1972 her handicap decreased by 5 shots to 31. On 10 May 1973 she was down to an 18 handicap which put her into A Grade. With still more shots to be lost, January 1985 saw her handicap at 9 with her lowest ever being a 7. Wow.. this is something most of us only dream of!

Dell's major golfing successes included:

- Bargara club champion twice
- Hervey Bay zone champion
- 2 x hole in ones one at Bargara and one at Bundaberg
- Vets champion 1995 and 1996

Dell served on the golf committee 1973/74/75 and was Vice Captain in 1978/79 and then Captain in 1980/81/86/87.

Her playing career commenced with the Tuesday girls in 1972 and then the Mothers Club on a Thursday and Saturday. In 1988 Dell joined the Vets at age 50. After the death of her husband Clive in 2004, Dell joined the Vets committee and served for the next 12 years. In 2014 she was made a Life Member and in 2017 Patroness.

Dell's last game of golf was on 5 September 2017 but as we all know she has still kept a keen interest in the club and helps anytime she can. She laughingly calls herself the "Treasurers Offsider" when she assists Brian Durnford - she says, "so he can enjoy his beers when he comes in from his game". When the bell chimes on a Tuesday, we know it is time for Dell to announce the raffle winners and members draw. (Prior to this she has always organised money, prizes and set up for the afternoon.)

Thank you, Dell, for all you have done and continue to do to make the Bargara Vets a friendly, welcoming and enjoyable group. Your dedication and commitment is invaluable to us all.
