





DON McKEWEN

- The son of a dairy farmer who married a dairy farmer's daughter
- Has 3 children and 4 grandchildren

Don's 8 years of primary education was at Watch Box State School where the maximum number of students was 19 with only 1 male teacher. Thereafter 4 years of high school followed at Murgon State High. Don enjoyed these years and believes that he was able to receive basic life skills from a dedicated team of teachers.



Country life for him was pretty special with plenty of activities—sport, the local Saturday night dances, and the Rural Youth Organisation.

Don has always been involved with sport, mainly tennis and then in later years golf. Don and Pat's children likewise all play sport - tennis, cricket, golf, bowls with his grandchildren following in the McKewen sporting footsteps and playing hockey.

Don spent most of his working life working with Kraft Foods in the food industry (42 years) managing factories - cheese, yeast extract for vegemite, peanut roasting for peanut butter. Prior to joining Kraft in 1972 he worked for 3 small dairy co-operatives. Whilst at Maclagan (1970 to 1972) they won the Champion Cheese at the Royal Brisbane Show—Don boasts that this was his only claim to fame!

In April 1972, he was electrocuted (11000-volt overhead power line), however was fortunate to receive no major injuries.

Don and his family have lived in three states – Kenilworth Queensland for 8 years, Sutherland Shire in Sydney for 15 years and Cohuna Victoria for 15 years. In 2007 Don and Pat retired to Bargara. The move to Bargara has proved very rewarding for Don and Pat, both becoming involved with the Bargara Golf Club and the community in general where they have made great friends. They have also travelled to all continents mainly with their Bundaberg Friendship Force Club.

Don has had many roles within the Bargara Vets:

- Vice President for 1 year
- Captain for 11 years (current)

Also within the Bargara Golf Cub

- Men's match committee for 4 years
- Board member for 1 year
- Club President for 5 years

Don is currently also a committee member of the Wide Bay Veteran Golfers.
