Thanks to Rod and his green staff and the volunteers for the excellent course presentation.

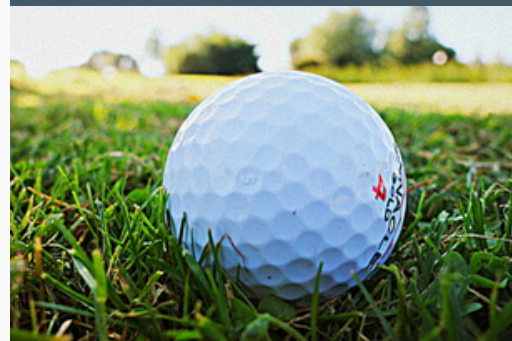

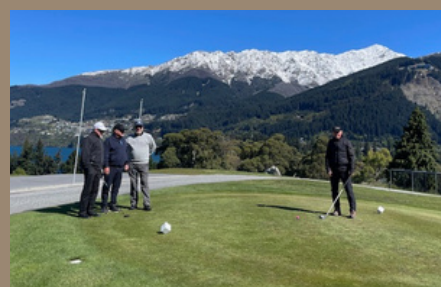

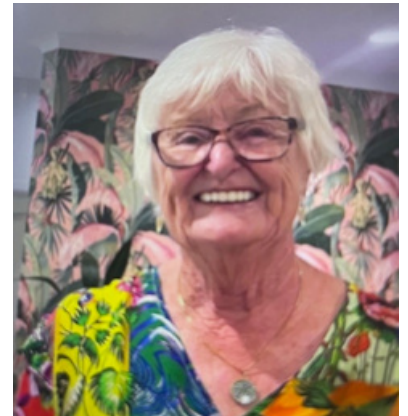

SPOTLIGHT

BARBARA CHARTERS



Barbara or Barb as she is fondly called, was born and raised in Glen Innes in NSW. After completing her schooling, she worked at the local pharmacy for 5 years before heading to Sydney to live.

It was there that she met Rod in 1961 and they married a year later in 1962. In 1966 they relocated to Bundaberg to assist Rod's father with his insurance business. Barbara worked part time in the business after Rod took over the business after the death of his father. Together they had four children - 2 boys and 2 girls who as you can imagine kept her very busy.

Barbara decided she needed a little time to herself and after seeing an advertisement "Learn to Play Golf" signed up for these lessons under the pro at the time - Norm Hobbs. She enjoyed her "me" time immensely and that was the beginning of her keen golfing pursuits.

Barbara joined the Bargara Golf Club in 1972 and has been a continuous active playing member since then. Throughout her 53 years at the club, she has represented the Club at numerous District Club Open days and Country Week events as well as Midweek Pennants for over 30 years.

When her four children all played with the Bargara Junior Club, Barbara was on hand to help with the organization of their competitions. The Bargara Belles was a competition started by Professional, Norm Hobbs to cater for women players just joining the club. Barbara was on hand to play with these beginners and help them understand the rules and etiquette of playing golf.

In the late 1980's Barbara joined the Women's Match Committee and in 1988 was elected Women's Vice Captain a position she held the next year. Barbara then stepped up to the roll of Women's Captain in 1990 and then held this position for the next two years. In 2003 Barbara was again elected to the position of Women's captain for one year. stepping down as Women's Captain in 1993 Barbara represented Bargara Golf Club on the Wide Bay Zone Committee where she was President for two years.

In 2024 Barbara was elected Patroness of the club and has run and donated all the trophies for the Patroness Day that year. In 2025 Barbara was awarded Honorary Life Membership of the Bargara Golf Club.
